#### ROBERT DROLET LEGACY

Robert Drolet was born on July 25, 1922 in Kankakee, Illinois. Although he spent more than 60 years living in Southern California, Robert never forgot his early years in Kankakee.

Robert was the ninth of thirteen children born to Emile Pierre and Anna Bonnie Caron Drolet. Robert developed a love of sports early in life; however, his family's budget had no room for a membership to the YMCA. Thanks to the generosity of YMCA supporters, Robert received a free membership. The YMCA became his home away from home.

Robert graduated from Kankakee H.S. in 1942 and immediately enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Forces. Trained as a pilot and stationed at Lecce Airfield in Italy, Robert served as a radio operator /turret gunner on a B-24 Liberator bomber, completing 35 bombing missions in the Mediterranean Theater of Operations and receiving the Army Air Forces Award for Valor. After serving our country, Robert used the G-I bill to earn a Bachelor's degree and Master of Science degree. Staying true to his love of sports, he then coached and taught at Corpus Christi High School in Galesburg, Illinois. Robert's influence in motivating and developing the character of the young men he coached resulted in many of those relationships turning into lifelong friendships.

In later years, Robert was an accomplished entrepreneur and real estate broker, owning and managing several businesses in Southern California. Robert finally retired at age 87. He passed away on October 11, 2016 at the age of 94 after an incredible lifetime of adventure and achievement. It is a tribute to his passion for sports and commitment to developing young men that several of his former student athletes travelled to attend the funeral and have a chance to say goodbye and share their memories of "Coach Robert".



### **SAFETY AROUND WATER**

The **Splash program** held at the YMCA and funded by **Peoples Bank** plays a vital role in the lives of Kankakee County youth by addressing the leading cause of unintentional deaths of children ages 1–14 years old. This unique community partnership began in October 2017 and provides second graders from **Mark Twain Elementary School** with lessons held at the Kankakee Area YMCA with funding provided by **Peoples Bank** for the program, swimsuits and transportation to and from school twice weekly.



The Splash by Peoples Bank program provided swim lessons to about 180 second grade
students attending Mark Twain Elementary School during the 2017-18 school year. Each second grade class in turn was bused
back and forth twice weekly during the school day for 45 minute swim lessons at the Y. Y swim instructors teach the children to
swim and participate in water activities confidently and to stay safe. The focus is on water safety, having fun and building
character. The goal for each child participating in the program is to know the life-saving skill of swimming and how to be safe
around water. The children learn about safety topics such as pool rules, calling 911, and keeping themselves safe by learning to
"reach, throw, no go". By making the program part of the school day, providing transportation to the swim lessons and
supplying swim suits and towels, the Splash program removes barriers to learning about water safety that children and families
may otherwise not be able to overcome.

To provide the lessons to the community, there are costs that the Y cannot sustain by itself. **Peoples Bank** is providing the Y assistance with the staffing costs, swim suits for the children and transportation to and from the YMCA.

# 2017 JERRY BLITZ AWARD HONOREE JANE MEYER

If ever there was a friend of this organization, it was Jerry Blitz. In his short time on this earth, Jerry taught everyone how to **live**, **laugh**, and even die with **effervescence**. He enjoyed every day to its fullest and gave his time tirelessly, often without being asked.

Jerry was known for his **honesty** and for his **wisdom**. He was revered for taking projects by the horns and plowing full speed ahead. He often said, "Don't just sit there and talk about doing something. Either do it or don't do it."

The Jerry Blitz Layman of the Year Award is the highest "thank you" that the Kankakee Area YMCA can give to an individual. Award winners are selected and judged on five criteria: **Example, Loyalty, Enthusiasm, Sharing**, and **Determination**. These five qualities capture the essence of Jerry; his **wisdom**, his **teaching**, and his **spirit**.



Starting in 2007, this year's award winner, Jane Meyer, and her husband, Al, approached area nurseries regarding the donation of items to improve the landscaping around the Y. Jane initially secured 8 trees and many shrubs and plants from Snider's Nursery. Art's Landscaping donated the planning for landscape design. Jane put together a team of volunteers to plant the donated items. In fact, she convinced one of the volunteers, Jim Saindon, to drive his tractor over five miles from his home to auger the holes for the trees. On a spring afternoon in 2007, this team planted all of the donated items.

In the years that followed, Jane and her ever present husband could be seen diligently tending to the Y's landscaping from April through October. This couple would receive the title of Y Outdoor Beautification Co-Directors. Dirk would often refer to them as the "Y's Landscaping Angels".

This dynamic duo's efforts improved the Y's curb appeal immeasurably. Most notable was their improvement at the main entrance to the Y. This area became a conversation piece for many of our members, who would comment on the beauty of the plants and how it brightened their day. Over the years of their tending to the Y's landscaping, their efforts made the Y a brighter and more inviting facility for our community. Jane represents the award's criteria of **Example, Loyalty, Enthusiasm, Sharing, and Determination.** She is an extraordinary volunteer and representative of the mission of the Kankakee Area YMCA.

## **SHARON JACKSON**

The **Ray Lindner Service to Youth Award** is given annually by the Y Service Club. It singles out an **individual** in our community who **leads by example** and devotes themselves when possible to **further youth quality of life**. Ray Lindner was such a man.

This award is meant to serve as an example and not a memorial. The Y Service Club, an International Service Club of the Y, hopes you will feel challenged and inspired by the recipient and the award.

Sharon (Soucie) Jackson, a native of Kankakee, has done many things to deserve the Ray Lindner award. In 1985 Sharon was hired at Bishop McNamara as the Recruitment and Public Relations director and Moderator of the Irish Alumni Association Board. She also worked in Development, Fundraising and Special Events while at Bishop McNamara. Under her direction the Irish Alumni Association started the Annual Fund, Phonathon, Mass of Celebration prior to fall sports events, the Irish Golf Classic and the Grand Reunion for alumni graduating between 1930 and 1955.



Sharon coordinated the Thanksgiving Dinner held on Thanksgiving Day for those in need. This annual dinner impacted many members of the community. Her family also helped, with two of her sons coming from Colorado one year to cook 900 pounds of turkey. Sharon served the Kankakee community in other ways, serving on the Bishop McNamara School Board, as moderator of the Z-Club and establishing the "Sharon Club". This club recognizes Bishop McNamara students who have completed 100 or more hours of Christian service to the community.

One of Sharon's greatest strengths is getting volunteers to help with community events and projects. To this day, the phrase "Who can say no to Sharon?" is still used. Sharon is truly deserving of the Ray Lindner Service to Youth award, and we thank her for all her acts of service.




